



Shop operations projected for relocation in January

Construction continues at Pepperwood Plaza in Iowa City to transform the former Kmart building into the new Crowded Closet Thrift Shop. Some initial operations may begin relocation in January. The timeline will develop around occupancy date, to be confirmed. Donation receiving will continue at all stages of relocation and is projected to be the first phase of operations in the new shop. Grand opening date to be determined.

What will be the same?

Volunteers will continue to be the “heart and soul” of Crowded Closet. Over 250 active volunteers serve regularly, and hundreds more join for one-time or short-term service.

Giving to Mennonite Central Committee will continue and is projected to increase as shop activity grows.

What will be different?

Ease of donation drop-off. Accessible drive-thru with automatic doors at donation entrance will improve service to donors.

All operations under one roof. Crowded Closet presently owns the thrift shop, and a storage building across the street for salvage goods and seasonal inventory. The new facility unites all operations under one roof for increased safety and efficiency.

Frequently Asked Questions:

Does Crowded Closet own all of the former Kmart building? No, Crowded Closet has purchased slightly over 50% of the building.

Is the new location bigger? Yes, Crowded Closet currently owns 30,000 square feet (sf) with both buildings combined. Current retail space is 15,000 sf. The new location will be 50,000 sf: 24,000 retail, 14,000 processing and storage, and 12,000 sf expansion space which will be initially rented out for income.



Few thrift stores offer buttons sewn by hand on card stock, fabric neatly measured and rolled, tidy wrapped bundles of yarn, fresh new feather pillows, every color of thread, embroidery floss, zippers, and unique, vintage linens. The department includes sewing accessories, as well as sheets, blankets, curtains, towels, tablecloths, and more.

Donors sometimes share unfinished projects, like cross-stitch and quilts. These project pieces are received with love and care and sold to inspire the hobbies of shoppers.

Committed volunteers patiently assess each donation. Compassionate volunteers deliver linens to those who process donations from home. The impact of Crowded Closet is possible because of the many hours volunteers spend carefully preparing donations for sale.
